Never release your plants or animals into the wild! It is cruel, unethical and **illegal** and these plants and animals can become invasive.

What Should I Do Instead?

- » Contact the retailer where you purchased the animal to see if they will take it back.
- » Contact science centers, zoos or aquariums to see if they can use the animal for educational purposes.
- » Dry and freeze unwanted plants and add them to non-composted trash.
- » Consider humane euthanasia by a veterinarian.
