Post 2: Clean, Drain, Dry

Love swimming, fishing, or boating? So do we! But aquatic invasive species, like Zebra Mussels, can hitch a ride on boats, gear, and even bait—spreading silently between lakes and rivers.

Here are a few small actions that make a BIG difference:

- 🔶 Clean, drain, and dry your boat, trailer, and gear between waterbodies
- 📢 Never release fish, plants, or animals into new waters
- **Properly dispose** of live bait
- **(i)** Learn to identify and report aquatic invaders

Post 3: Buy Local, Burn Local

Invasive species, climate change, and wildfires are threatening Canada's forests.

But even in the face of these big challenges, our **small actions** can help protect our woodlands.

- **Buy Local, Burn Local** never move firewood and burn it where you buy it
- Y Use park-designated firewood drop-offs or purchase locally sourced bundles
- 🕗 Always look for the **"kiln-dried"** stamp when buying firewood
- S Follow local fire bans and restrictions
- Learn to spot and report forest pests and their egg masses

Every action counts in keeping our forests healthy and resilient.
